### **Important Dates to Remember**

July 7 – Livestock entries MUST be postmarked (livestock excluding poultry and dairy goats)

- Livestock entry form(s)
- COOL form(s) if required [market animals]
- Correct payment (made payable to UCWEF)

July 15 – Buyer signature papers are due to the Mifflinburg FFA Department.

- 4 business signatures per market animal exhibitor
- Only 1 duplicate signature per family

August 1 7pm – 1<sup>st</sup> of 2 mandatory livestock meetings in the arena at fairgrounds (you MUST attend 1, not both)

August 6-12 - UCWEF

August 6 3pm – 2<sup>nd</sup> of 2 mandatory livestock meetings in the arena at fairgrounds (you MUST attend 1, not both)

August 15 - Fair clean up night. Must attend to receive premium check

- UCWEF Tag (this number needs to be listed on the CVI) [UCWEF XXX]

- Shipping fever shots required
- 840 RFID Scannable tag

#### **Market Lamb and Market Goat**

Official USDA Scrapie Tag

## **Breeding Beef and Dairy Cattle**

- Shipping fever shots required
- Rabies vaccination is recommended
- 840 RFID Scannable tag

# **Breeding Sheep and Breeding Meat Goat**

- Rabies vaccination recommended
- Official USDA Scrapie Tag

# UCWEF Livestock Weight Requirements

#### **Market Swine**

• 220-290lb

#### **Market Lamb**

• 80-170lb

#### **Market Goat**

• 60-120lb

#### **Market Steer**

• 1050-1600lb

#### **Dairy Beef**

400-800lb

## **Meat Pen (rabbit)**

• 3.5-5.5lb

# FAQ's:

- What should I wear to exhibit my livestock project at the fair?
  - Jeans, collared shirt with at least 3 buttons, tucked in and leather shoes/boots
- I am showing rabbits at the fair this year; do I have to feed them?
  - Yes, in face, you do! All rabbit exhibitors are required to feed and water their exhibits. They must also supply the feed. The fair will provide feed dishes and automatic waters
- Can I drop my entries off at the department heads house?
  - o NO! All entries MUST BE MAILED
- Does the fair provide my animal exhibits with bedding?
  - If you are exhibiting pigs, the answer is no, you must provide the shavings. If you are exhibiting other livestock, the fair will provide initial bedding, please bring your own to bed your animals for the week of the fair.
- Do I have to clean my pens out after the fair?
  - YES! All pens MUST BE CLEANED at the conclusion of the fair or you will be losing 10% of your premium check. It is not the fairs responsibility to clean up after your animals
- After the sale I don't have to take care of my animal anymore, right?
  - WRONG! You are responsible for the welfare and care of your animal until it is loaded up and headed out of the fairgrounds
- I am not happy with the weight of my animal; can I weight it again?
  - No! All animals will be weighed ONCE at the designated weighing area and that will be the declared weight.
